# Year 6 Curriculum Overview – Summer 2

## Maths

In maths this half term, we will apply our knowledge to a range of problem-solving tasks and games. During our enterprise project, we will also learn about managing money, budgets and profit margins. The children will develop their use of problem-solving and entrepreneurial skills by being independent and creative with their use of maths.

## English

In English this half term, we will continue to write for a range of audiences and purposes, applying the grammar and punctuation we have learned so far. We will also be developing our speaking and performance skills as we prepare and rehearse for our leavers' assembly to be held on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> July at 2:00pm.

## Enterprise

We are really looking forward to organising our summer fair to be held on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> June. The children will be working in small groups to set up their own 'business'. This will involve creating a corporate identity for their business as well as identifying a target audience. The children will learn about advertising, buying, overheads, costing and profit.

## Science

In science this half term the children will recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines. They will be given the opportunity to use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye and to explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.

# History

In history this half term, our focus will be British history beyond 1066. We will be learning about some 'mighty monarchs' and how the power of the monarchy changed over time. We will focus on four mighty monarchs: King John I, King Henry VIII, Queen Mary I and King Charles I.

## Spanish

In Spanish this half term, we will learn ten phrases for activities we may do at the weekend. The children will have the knowledge and skills to talk about what they do at the weekend, enabling them to create more detailed and personalised responses by the end of the unit.
