#### Maths



As part of our Early Years curriculum, we will be introducing our half termly 'Super Six' texts. This will be a selection of books and stories, carefully planned across the six themes above. Some of these texts will be our focus for literacy work or topic work, and some we will just enjoy sharing together during story times.

This overview will give you some ideas about **some** of the things we will be learning in Reception this half term. However, in Early Years, we plan learning to be through active, first-hand experiences and the children are given time for sustained play to explore, experiment and discover in both the indoor and outside environments, whatever the weather.

The reception curriculum is very much initiated and led by the children themselves. We spend time observing and playing with the children and plan resources, interactions, activities and experiences in response to the children's interests and needs.
