What will we be learning?

This half term, we will be learning about autumn. We will talk about some of the things we have observed such as conkers, acorns and berries.

<u>Maths</u>

This half term, we will be introducing numbers 1 and 2. We will learn to match the numeral to the correct amount. We will make repeating patterns with two objects, shapes and colours.
